Everyone on the grounds of T&D and representing T&D, at any venue, is governed by T&D and TBAWA rules and regulations — no exceptions.

Fines will be issued to anyone not complying with the code.

# Players' Code of Behaviour.

- 1. Learn the Rules of Teeball and always play by them.
- 2. Be a good sport.
- 3. Players must wear correct footwear, hats and be suitably attired in approved club uniform.
- 4. Verbal abuse of officials or other players is not acceptable or permitted.
- 5. Never argue with an Umpire, other players, Coaches or Officials this will result in immediate removal from the game as per TBAWA Rulebook. Fines also apply as per T&D Bylaws.
- 6. Teeball is a team game.
- 7. Play for the fun of it and to improve your Teeball skills, not just to please parents and coaches.
- 8. Abuse of equipment such as throwing helmets or bats is unacceptable.
- 9. Foul language or harassment of any sort will not be tolerated.
- 10. Medical clearances are required for any injuries or serious illnesses.
- 11. Teeball is a sport for all children. From time to time we will have children playing with special needs/disabilities. These children may require assistance to play. Prejudices against these children will NOT be tolerated.

## <u>Parents, Guardians and Spectators</u> <u>Code of Behaviour.</u>

- 1. Children play Teeball for fun. They play for their enjoyment not yours. Do not force an unwilling child to participate or expect more than their best efforts. Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- 2. Teeball is not a child minding service. At **all** training sessions **and** games please stay, support the team and volunteer to help. Coaches and officials deserve your respect and your support.
- 3. Applaud good play from all teams.
- 4. Encourage your child to always play within the Rules of Teeball and accept the Umpire's decision. Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise. If you disagree with an official or coach, raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question the person in public.
- 5. Never ridicule, abuse or yell at a child for making mistakes.
- 6. Offensive behaviour from anyone on Thornlie & Districts grounds is not acceptable in <u>any form</u> and under the Bylaws of our Association; action will be taken against all offenders.
- 7. Teeball is a team game.
- 8. Medical clearances are required for any injuries or serious illnesses.
- 9. Smoking and Alcohol is strictly prohibited on all parts of the grounds. Smoking permitted in car park only.
- 10. Foul language or harassment of any sort will not be tolerated.
- 11. Teeball is a sport for all children. From time to time we will have children playing with special needs/disabilities. These children may require assistance to play. Prejudices against these children will NOT be tolerated.

### Coaches/Managers Code of Behaviour.

- 1. Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of the players.
- 2. Medical clearances are required for any injuries or serious illnesses before recommencing training or games.
- 3. Know the Rules of Teeball and ensure your players always play within those rules.
- 4. Develop team respect for opponents and officials. Do not abuse or ridicule players or officials and do not allow your players to do so.
- 5. Ensure any discussions with umpires are kept below the level of argument, how you accept a decision will be reflected in your players.
- 6. Smoking and Alcohol is strictly prohibited on all parts of the grounds. Smoking permitted in car park only.
- 7. Do not tolerate players abusing equipment or misbehaving to the detriment of other players, coaches and officials at any time.
- 8. Keep yourself informed of Club and TBAWA coaching principles and seek more skilled advice when necessary.
- 9. Foul language or harassment of any sort will not be tolerated.
- 10. Teeball is a sport for all children. From time to time we will have children playing with special needs/disabilities. These children may require assistance to play. Prejudices against these children will NOT be tolerated.
- 11. Offensive behaviour from anyone on Thornlie & Districts grounds is not acceptable in <u>any form</u> and under the Bylaws of our Association; action will be taken against all offenders.

## Officials'/Umpires Code of Behaviour.

- 1. Compliment and encourage all participants. Give ALL children equal opportunities to participate. Teeball is a sport for all children. From time to time we will have children playing with special needs/disabilities. These children may require assistance to play. Prejudices against these children will NOT be tolerated.
- 2. Ensure that everyone involved in junior sport emphasizes fair play, not winning at all costs.
- 3. Compliment and encourage all participants.
- 4. Be consistent, objective and courteous when making decisions.
- 5. Condemn unsporting behaviour and promote respect for all opponents.
- 6. Be a good sport yourself. Actions speak louder than words.
- 7. Keep up to date with the latest trends in officiating.
- 8. Remember you set an example. Your behaviour and comments should be positive and supportive.
- 9. Smoking and Alcohol is strictly prohibited on all parts of the grounds. Smoking permitted in car park only.
- 10. Medical clearances are required for any injuries or serious illnesses.
- 11. Offensive behaviour from anyone on Thornlie & Districts grounds is not acceptable in <u>any form</u> and under the Bylaws of our Association; action will be taken against all offenders.
